Caesar Ford Park: 520 South Stringtown Road, Xenia, OH 45385



Greene County Parks & Trails' Caesar Ford Park, nearly 250 acres of parkland in Eastern Greene County. The site is the former home to the Blue Jacket outdoor drama, which closed approximately ten years ago. The park reopened to the public in 2018. A paved multi-use trail (Xenia-to-Jamestown Connector) cuts through the property giving direct access to more than 330 miles of paved trail, part of the nation's largest paved trail network. This connectivity gives Caesar Ford Park access to numerous communities via the trail system. Recent modification to the park has resulted in nearly 10 miles of multi-use trails cut through the facility, thanks to members of the Ohio Horseman's Council, as well as the removal of aging infrastructure and repairs to the amphitheater area. Caesar Ford Park is a unique property with rolling hills, woodlots, prairies and wetlands. A pristine riparian corridor can also be found with the south branch of the Caesar Creek flowing along the backside of the property. Caesar Ford Park offers diverse topography with unlimited potential for recreational purposes and outdoor education.
