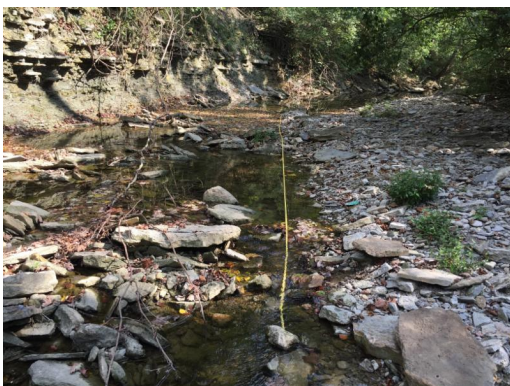
Welcome our Temporary Additions

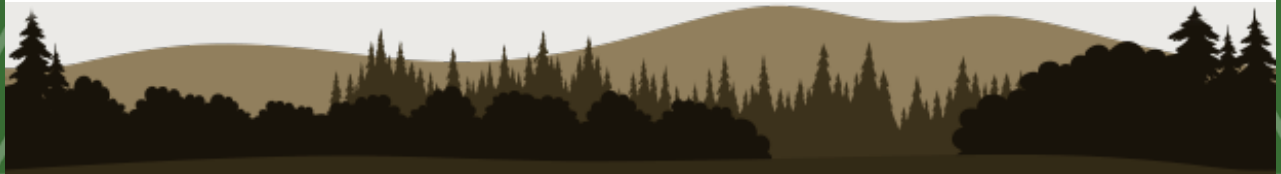


Cooper Creek Collaborative
